

Canada's IMPACT Conference is tackling issues facing global tourism head on.

Sessions, topics and speaker Wade Davis announced as early bird registration opens today

January 19 – 22, 2020 at the Victoria Conference Centre

August 1, 2019, Victoria, BC – As demand for resources and solutions is growing for tourism destination managers across Canada, the third annual IMPACT Sustainability Travel & Tourism Conference is expected to double registration, which opens today.

The <u>IMPACT Sustainability Travel & Tourism Conference</u> is held annually in Victoria in January (January 19 - 22, 2020) and was born to create a safe space for inspiring, candid conversations about tourism and sustainability in Canada. With a goal to capture actionable items and provide a foundation for year over year discussions, a <u>conference proceedings paper</u> is created each year.

"Since we wrapped IMPACT last January, discussions around what the legacy of the tourism industry will be for Canada have only grown more heated and urgent," says Paul Nursey, CEO of Destination Greater Victoria, one of four founding companies behind IMPACT. "Once again we are bringing people together from across the country, as well as international experts, who are concerned with the state of the industry nationally and globally and want to be a part of a necessary and critical change."

The first announced speaker for the conference is National Geographic Society (NGS) Explorer-in-Residence, <u>Wade Davis</u>. Named by NGS as one of the Explorers for the Millennium, Davis is an ethnographer, writer, photographer, and filmmaker, and holds degrees in anthropology, biology, and received his Ph.D. in ethnobotany, all from Harvard University. A British Columbia native, Davis is a licensed river guide, has worked as a park ranger, forestry engineer, and conducted ethnographic fieldwork among several Indigenous societies in Canada. The recipient of multiple prestigious awards, and a professional speaker for over 25 years, IMPACT is thrilled to welcome Davis as a speaker.

Keith Henry, president of the Indigenous Tourism Association of Canada will be returning as co-host of the Conference and will be joined by a representative from the Travel and Tourism Research Association (TTRA).
